# **Central Library**

Bhandarkars' College Library has a very good library with a collection of more than 95,500 books on various topics of interest for both the faculty arid student community. The library is functioning as a knowledge hub of the college. The library will be kept open from morning 8.00 AM to 5.15 PM in the evening in all working days. Both the faculty and students have the privileges to borrow books from the library. Books for references will be provided in the Evening in all working days. Efforts are made to computerize library functions and developing it has a learning resource center of the college.

The library is in the process to build and develop robust collections of documents of both print based resources and digital resources. The library collections consist of good number of reference materials and text books for the need of the student community. The library is subscribing good number of scholarly journals and popular magazines. Which are highly useful for faculty and students to engage in research and cultivate research skills. Every day on an average 120 students visits college library for borrowing books and for referencing. The succeeding section of this report provides detailed information on library collections, services provided for students and teaching community, best practices that is being practiced and future plan to enhance the quality of the library services at the Bhandarkars' Art and Science College Kundapura.

- The history of Bhandarkars' library, which spans more than 59 years, will give you an idea of the contents it holds. Nearly 96,000 books are kept in the library, which has a primary focus on them. There are 130 different sorts of journals and publications, as well as college magazines, in our nicely organised periodicals area. Six of the 12 newspapers available to students are in Kannada, while the other six are in English.
- The campus library is housed in a four-story structure. We have a stack room on the ground floor that contains all 95,559 of the books we have stored there. We have a circulation counter for the charging and discharging system on the first floor. An OPAC is located at the first floor's entrance, and new arrivals are advertised there. There is a periodicals section after the counter where students can utilise the 130 various journals and magazines. A 20-node e-resource centre has been built nearby so that students can use the internet and e-resources to get information for their academic endeavours. A lounge area is located on the first floor. Display of the list of rank holders. A miniature version of the college campus, boy's restrooms, a water cooler, an elevator, a reading room for newspapers, a circulation desk, a section for magazines and periodicals, an Internet café, a section for new arrivals, a place to display literary works by management, staff, alumni, and students, and a notice board.

- A thoughtfully constructed reading room with seating for 140 students is located on the second floor. The reading room has been divided into three sections: one for girls, one for everyone; these two rooms contain all of the academic study materials; the third section is the reference room, which contains all of the rare books, dictionaries, encyclopaedias, and many other priceless books; it also contains competitive exam materials for things like government exams and other things. The user can do group studies in this space as well.
- AV and conference rooms are located on the upper floor. For people who have a particular interest in art and produce amazing works of art, we also offer an art gallery. There is display space for our college magazine and honours. A boys-only restroom with a relaxing atmosphere is available.

- The software's circulation module handles every aspect of circulation, including member record creation and the printing of reminders for overdue books. The single screen Issue, Return, and Renewal with all member details, membership records with photos, and statistical reports on membership are the module's standout features.
- The fully atomized KOHA ILMS software is used in the library. This programme automates every step of the system charging and discharging procedure. It offers a range of choices for the team to include fresh material and new ideas. This programme is modifiable, so we may change it to suit our requirements. The new update can be uploaded to OPAC with ease as well.
- We selected DDC for catalogue. Using it as a guide, the stock room's arrangement of library volumes was made. Students can request books by placing slips in the box before 9.30am with the aid of OPAC, and they will receive their books by after 12pm.
- Students can browse our online public access catalogue to find any book they're interested in. Students can use OPAC to check whether a book is in our library and then use that information to request books.
- In our library, there are three different types of book issue systems. One is the card issue, whereby students can borrow two books for a week via their ID card, and the other is the book bank. Students are permitted to borrow books from the book bank service for the duration of their whole semesters. The final option is an overnight issue service, which is only accessible if the requested book is out of stock and is only available for one day.
- Today, e-resources are a crucial component of library services. Many of the crucial academic resources are now
  offered in digital versions. For instance, scholarly literature like journals, conference volumes, and books is now
  mostly only available in electronic versions. Access to electronic materials is now required of libraries in this

situation. On a consortium basis, UGC INFLIBNET offers a sizable selection of electronic journals and books. We have secured membership in the N-LIST e-resources consortia and may now use the e-resources provided by the N-LIST programme.

## 6. Library Collections

A library's collection is an important indicator of any good library. The library users' satisfaction largely depends on the kind of library collections that the libraries possess. In this connection, here at the library in Bhandarkars' College, we have taken the utmost care to develop robust collections of books on various subjects of knowledge. Reference materials, scholarly works, and the development of good collections of Kannada literature and English literary works have all received funding. We have strictly followed government instructions and Department of Collegiate Education (DCE) instructions and guidelines in purchasing books and journals for the library. Our LAC also plays an important role in developing library collections. The library consists of **94939** books (as of March 31st 2022) in total, with 66,000 titles and subscriptions, along with 24 national and regional scholarly journals and magazines. Since 2016, we have also obtained an annual membership for accessing N-LIST electronic resources from UGC-INFLIBNET. The following section contains detailed information on the number of library books and the associated expenses. The following sections go into greater detail.

#### 1. Books

Our top goal is reading, and we mostly concentrate on reference books rather than textbooks. The library of Bhadrakars believes in its own grandeur and is not motivated by numbers. Our 95,000-book collection includes more than 66,000 titles, which speaks to the caliber of the collection and the purpose of the purchase. We have a large number of collections that many libraries do not have access to. Our current emphasis is on student ideas, competitive tests, and current bestsellers by trending writers, and success and motivational stories. When acquiring library materials, it's important to bear in mind that these materials should encourage critical thinking and creativity among students and teachers. Evolution of the library's collection, Development of the library collection, particularly the acquisition of library books, is reliant on the grants we get from various sources.
